

Possible Job Opportunity at National University of Singapore for Research Project on “A Mixed Modality Study of Marriage, Marital Education and Meanings of Family”

We are seeking an enthusiastic and capable full-time **Research Assistants (2 positions)** for the above project at the Centre for Family and Population Research, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, National University of Singapore. The appointment is subject to the approval of the grant for the research project and will be **tenable for a period of 1 year** at the first instance, with the possibility of renewal.

The Centre for Family and Population Research in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (FASS) in NUS is dedicated to scientific advancement of research and training in the study of trends, determinants, and consequences of family and population changes, particularly changes in Asia.

Write-up about the project

This mixed modality study will involve both quantitative and qualitative methods to provide data in understanding the histories of marriage, divorce, family relationship history, attitudes, values and behavior. The study will assess factors shaping patterns such as basic demographic and socioeconomic characteristics, family dynamics, living arrangements, child and elderly care arrangement, household division of labour and other related concerns of marital lives. The qualitative methods will map and chart relations and connections between marriage education providers on one side and target participants on the other end. A quantitative survey will be conducted on recent cohorts of Singaporeans to explore the meanings of marriage not just in relation to attitudes but also about knowledge, aptitude and values attached to various forms of consensual unions. A main focus of the research is to measure and assess the effectiveness of marriage education programmes by following the trajectories of married couples and individuals in various arrangements of marriage over a period of three years.

The two **Research Assistant** positions are intended to provide research and administrative management support to the project: **“A Mixed Modality Study of Marriage, Marital Education and Meanings of Family”** with Associate Professor Maznah Mohamad as the Principal Investigator.

The duties of the **Research Assistants** include the following:

- Provide assistance in administrative and research work related to data collection
- Conduct various aspects of data collection from participant observation to recruiting and interviewing respondents,
- Assist in the transcription of audio recordings, data coding, database management, analysis, and report writing
- Assist the research team in other activities such as the organization of meetings and conferences
- Other ad-hoc duties as assigned

The candidate should possess the following:

- A Bachelors degree in Humanities or Social Science Discipline from a recognized university
- Excellent written and spoken communication skills
- Strong organizational skill and interpersonal skill
- Prior field work and research assistance experience is a plus

Terms and Conditions

Appointment is subject to the approval of the grant for the research project. Possible commencement date is August/September 2019.

The appointment will be tenable for a period of one year at the first instance with a possibility for extension.
