

**Visiting Fellowship in 'Singapore Studies'**

Applications are invited for a Visiting Fellowship in the Department of Geography at the National University of Singapore, commencing **January 2010** (or at the latest **July 2010**). The post has been created for the teaching of a Singapore Studies/General Education module at Level 2000. The successful candidate will teach a once-per-semester module on the 'Changing Landscapes of Singapore' (with a student body of around 450 each semester; i.e. module to be taught twice a year). The position is ideally suited for an educator excelling in teaching large classes at an introductory level. This module covers a range of social, cultural and urban perspectives on Singapore (including but not limited to issues like '*globalization*', '*heritage*', '*community politics*' and '*environment*'). Some experience of conducting research and organizing half-day field trips in Singapore is thus an advantage.

Interviews will be conducted from November 2009 until a suitable candidate is found. The Visiting Fellow position will commence during the second semester of the NUS academic year 2009/10; i.e. **January 2010** onwards or **July 2010 at the latest** (for an initial period of two years, which can be extended subject to performance).
